

THE COLOUR OF MIST



I knit this scarf in some amazing, sport-weight 100% angora yarn, but the pattern would work with many different yarns. It's in multiples of 17 (+1), so if you want to increase the width (or use a thinner yarn), keep that in mind.

Gauge: not too important; use yarn and needles you prefer.

Materials: again, depends on your preference. My scarf comes in at 7 x 50" or so, and used about 120 grams of yarn.

Abbreviations:

K = knit

P = purl

YO = yarn over

SK2P = slip one, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over

K3tog = knit 3 stitches together

* _ * = repeat instructions between asterisks

Directions:

The first and last five stitches of every row are done in seed stitch and are not included in the pattern instructions below:

Odd rows - *P1, K1*

Even rows – *K1, P1*

The first stitch of every row is slipped for a tidy edge.

Cast on 45 stitches.

Work 5 rows in seed stitch.

Row 1 - *K10, YO, K1, YO, K3, SK2P*, K1

Row 2 and all even rows: P

Row 3 - *K11, YO, K1, YO, K2, SK2P*, K1

Row 5 - *K1, K3tog, K4, YO, K1, YO, K3, (YO, K1) twice, SK2P*, K1

Row 7 - *K1, K3tog, K3, YO, K1, YO, K9*, K1

Row 9 – K1, K3tog, K2, YO, K1, YO, K10*, K1

Row 11 – K1, K3tog, (K1, YO) twice, K3, YO, K1, YO, K4, SK2P*, K1

Row 12 – P

Repeat these rows until you are a couple of inches from your desired length.

Ending the lace pattern:

Row 13 – 16 – repeat rows 1 through 4

Row 17 - *K12, (YO, K1) twice, SK2P*, K1

Row 18 – P

Work 5 rows seed stitch, and cast off fairly loosely. The pattern will make a softly scalloped border on both ends.

Sew in the loose ends, and block the work if you like.



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
